

COVID Scenario	Response
<p>While at church a person shows symptoms* of COVID-19, without known exposure to a positive case**.</p> <p>*Symptoms are defined as: Temperature greater than 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, chills, fatigue, muscle and body aches, headache, sore throat, new loss of taste or smell, congestion or runny nose, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea</p> <p>**If known to have been exposed to a positive case, this person would have already been quarantined / see below.</p>	<p>(Adult)</p> <p>Request that the person, for the sake of others, leave the building as soon as possible</p> <p>Should not return to church until negative COVID test OR at least 10 days from start of symptoms AND at least 24 hours fever free (without medicine) AND improvement of any respiratory symptoms</p> <p>(Child)</p> <p>Immediate removal from the classroom</p> <p>Placed in supervised quarantine</p> <p>Parents are reached for immediate pickup</p> <p>Should not return until negative COVID test OR at least 10 days from start of symptoms AND at least 24 hours fever free (without medicine) AND improvement of any respiratory symptoms</p>
<p>Person tests positive for COVID-19 with symptoms.</p>	<p>Should not come to church for 10 days from start of symptoms AND at least 24 hours fever free (without medicine) AND improvement of any symptoms</p>
<p>Person tests positive for COVID-19 with NO symptoms.</p>	<p>Should not come to church for 10 days from test date AND no symptoms</p>
<p>Person with no symptoms is notified they have had “close contact”* with a person who has tested positive for COVID-19.</p> <p>*Close contact is defined as having spent 15 minutes or more within six feet of someone with the virus irrespective of either person wearing a mask. Close contact could include direct physical contact (hug, kiss, etc.), sharing eating or drinking utensils or being sneezed on, coughed on, or otherwise having contacted respiratory droplets. Contact could have been in the period from 2 days before symptom onset (in the case of a person with symptoms) or 2 days before the date of the test (in the case of someone asymptomatic) until they meet the criteria for discontinuing isolation.</p>	<p>Isolate for 14 days after last exposure</p> <p>Self-monitor for COVID symptoms (Check temperature twice daily)</p>
<p>Person has traveled outside the county.</p>	<p>Should monitor their health upon their return and not come to church if they present with any symptoms of COVID.</p>
<p>Person who has tested positive for COVID-19 has attended a church event/activity within the 14 days leading up to their test.</p>	<p>Following proper church protocols would prohibit anyone from having “close contact” while at church.</p> <p>Congregation will be notified that someone testing positive has attended a church event/activity.</p> <p>Anyone having attended the same event/activity will be encouraged to monitor their own health for COVID related symptoms including daily temperature checks.</p> <p>No one having attended the same event/activity will be asked not to come to church while without symptoms.</p>
