- 3) What is the worldly definition of spirituality (v. 21)? How does that definition bring about its own death (see v. 22)? How can false definitions of spirituality "look good" (v. 23a)? What is the ultimate effectiveness of rules based spirituality (v. 23b)?
- 4) What does it mean to have "died with Christ to the elemental spirits of the world" (v 20)? Who is the "Head" who brings true spiritual growth (v. 19)? Who is the substance of true spirituality (v. 17)? What are some ways that you can kill legalism in your own life?
