- 3) How does an understanding of the history, archaelogy, and geography of Abram's time and movements help our understanding of Genesis 12:1-9? Trace Abram's movements on a map. What similarities do we have with early Middle Bronze (Abram's) culture? How can we respond to our cultural challenges with faith, calling on the name of the Lord?
- 4) How does Abram show faith in God? How does God show He is a God of promise? What might be behind the detail that Sarai and Lot are with Abram?
- 5) How old was Abram when he left Haran for Canaan? What does that say about the idea of age in taking bold acts of faith? (v. 4)
- 6) Why does Abram build altars to the Lord? (vv. 7-8) Given Abram's family history (see Joshua 24:2, 14-15), how is Abram changing the script for his family from now on?
